Healthy Weight

OBESITY

For adults, a Body Mass Index (BMI) of 30 or more.

For children up to age 18, a BMI at or above the 95th percentile for age and gender.


Approximately 27% of adults and 9% of children in the US are obese.

OVERWEIGHT

For adults, a BMI of 25 or more.

For children, again, it is age and gender specific.

About two-thirds of adults and 15% of children in the US are overweight



SOCIAL PRESSURE

Prejudice against overweight people is very prevalent.

Sometimes this can cause more harm than the extra weight.

This pressure is a factor in the increasing numbers of teens with anorexia and bulimia sometimes with fatal consequences.

It has been shown that the quality of life of an obese child is equal to that of a child with cancer.

Pressure from family, friends, and medical establishment causes many to opt for quick-fix fad diets.





HEALTHY LIFE-STYLE

Maintaining a weight AND a selfimage that is healthy for YOU and helping those you love do the same requires:

Changes in eating that can be made permanent.

Changes in physical activity that are enjoyed and will become a habit.
Using your spirituality as well as meditation and/or prayer to find YOUR healthy balance





YO-YO DIETING

Over 95% of the people who lose substantial amounts of weight gain it (and more) back.

Those few who maintain their new weight over time have these three characteristics in common:

They lost the weight slowly; they drink a lot of water; they exercise regularly.
