CHURCH ON FIRE

Today there are a number of expressions used to describe a person, an event or an organization that is operating at their best. In fact, if they are accomplishing their goal perfectly, with enthusiasm and vigor it is commonly said that, "they are on fire". Currently, if we were to evaluate the American church of today, it would be fair to say that the fire is gone. Finally, because the preaching of the word has been watered down, so has the fire. The fire burns hot when the word is preached with fire, truth and spiritual conviction.

Although this is just a fraction of the issues the church is facing, suffice is to say it is past time for the church to catch on fire. It is time for the saints of God to catch on fire. It is time for us to return to sharing Christ with the lost, to worshipping God in spirit and in truth and living holy and boldly before a sick and dying world. The Three for Three Challenge is a tool that I believe God gave me vision for that it may assist the church to catching on fire again. In case you did not know, the Three for Three Challenge, challenges all Christians to lead three people to Christ, encourage three people to unite with a bible believing church and lead three people to get involved in church ministry in the span of three months. 



If you have high blood pressure, diabetes or a family history of kidney disease, you're at risk for chronic kidney disease (CKD).
