RETURNING FROM SABBATICAL

Hello everyone who still reads the newsletter articles. Today as I sit writing this article my sabbatical is rapidly coming to an end. A sabbatical is defined by Oxford language Dictionary as an extended period of leave from work, typically to rest, study and/or travel. Usually, one year for every seven years worked. As I delved in deeper, I found that six months to a year is the typical timeframe of a sabbatical. So, with all that technical definition, I guess I really should be off for four to ten more months. In Mark 6:3, after having sent the disciples out to do front line ministry. Jesus called them together and said. "Come aside by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while.' For there were many coming and going, and they did not even have time to eat." I can honestly identify with those words as over the last two and half years I have felt the lack of opportunity to adequately and sufficiently pull away from the comings and goings of ministry. My observation has been that Covid created a greater demand for ministry in multiple and new ways while it also revealed and perhaps created a lack of or pulling back of helpers in the ministry. While many more needed and wanted to be ministered to, many also abandoned the work to the pastor and a few others who were faithful. So the load was great but the laborers few. I am very sure this is why so many of my pastoral colleagues left and are leaving the ministry. Needless to say, rest is very important in ministry. Not only did Jesus call His disciples to it but He, Himself often stepped away, alone to pray and rejuvenate for the assignments ahead. I am praying for more of God's people to step up and be faithful to Him, not me, that needs of ministry may be more efficiently met.

This time away has proven vital to me. I was able to rest. I mean truly rest, mentally, physically, spiritually and emotionally. I realized during this time how much I have not been able to do and focus on. I was able to go hiking with my granddaughter, fishing with my grandson and brother, take my mom away to see her siblings, dates with my daughters, hangout with my son, and spend tons

of valuable, peaceful, quality time with my lovely wife. I was also able to hear from and speak to God about my life and the life of the ministry of Kettering Baptist. These were priceless experiences that only God could make happen. I am so grateful for this last two months off and for the many prayers you may have prayed on our behalf. Thank you for that.

I also had an unusual experience while I was away traveling. I cannot remember where I was at the time but I was laying back just thanking God that I was feeling so at peace and grateful for all He has done and was doing at the moment. About that time, the Lord said to me, "What if this was virtual?" Imagine with me if you will going to Myrtle Beach, Cancun or the Dominican Republic virtually. Your wave jumping and swimming time is virtual, your tanning and naps on the beach, virtual and after a few hours of that you go back to your virtual hotel room to get ready for dinner. When you get to dinner, the camera pans over all your favorite and not so favorite foods and there are hands preparing you a virtual plate of food, overrunning of course because you are on vacation. Now when it comes time to eat it you can see the fork raising food to your mouth and noises of enjoyment, you even get to see the camera pan on others who are there enjoying the meal, laughing and having a great time. It is at that time it dawned on me, that there are some things that you just have to be there to gain the full benefit of. Two things specifically strike me regarding this lesson, virtual worship is not the same as being there, and virtual rest does not give me the same benefit as true rest. I just have to be there to enjoy both to the fullest. Guess what so do you. Let me close with this thought will you be ok with going to virtual heaven while all the other believers get to actually go to be with the Lord in person, face to face? Don't get me wrong, virtual experiences have their place but some things you just need to be there to reap the full glory and benefit of. I am so glad Kettering to be returning from actual sabbatical.
